- Gabe opened the meeting with a few moments of silence followed by the Serenity Prayer.
- Karen read the 12 Traditions.
- Introduction of group members took place.
- 5 copies of the minutes to be printed for groups.

- 27 members were in attendance.
- The committee waived the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.
 - The October 4 minutes reported that Owen had stepped down from the telephone committee. Instead, he temporarily stepped aside.

Telephone report

- Operating balance of \$4,314.56, plus the prudent reserve of \$2,166.43, totalled: \$6,480.99.
- Phone bill was \$105.34. Bell Aliant has restructured and reduced our bill, which may recommend keeping the third cell phone.
