Corrections:

I have been informed by the prison that all new volunteers entering the prison will require a vulnerable sector check instead of a criminal record check. A vulnerable sector check is a police information check plus a check to see if a person has a record suspension (pardon) for sexual offences. This check is good for three years and there isn't any additional cost associated with it. As of now anyone whose clearance is over three years old will have to have a vulnerable sector check completed. At this time it is uncertain how this will effect those already cleared in the last three year. This has been a quiet month. Two people have had their vulnerable sector check documents submitted to the Prison for clearance and are awaiting confirmation. We are still in need of volunteers to put on meetings in the prison. If you are interested or know someone who would be interested, please have them contact me. Kelly D.

Question: Is there a new process for the vulnerable sector check?

Answer: No, it's the same process of going to the police station, with the same form, but you must ask for the vulnerable sector check specifically. All new volunteers will need this; not clear on status of current volunteers but if your criminal record check is more than 3 years old you will definitely have to have this new one processed.

As this was brought up by a member who is not in attendance tonight, we will add this to the agenda for next month.

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Heads of Committees meeting provincially:

I think this is a good idea. Tim attempted to do that one year in Nfld. It may be something to be added to the agenda for the service weekend to have meetings arranged for committees from across the province to come together to exchange their experience and knowledge. We would make this suggestion formally to districts 1 & 2 and let them discuss it.

Comment: Perhaps it would be best not to separate the committees out from the general discussion at service weekend but to have everyone involved.

Question: Who will pay for this, and will it be budgeted for a committee chair to go to the service weekend whether it's in Nfld or NS.
