Mid winter round up deadline - Paul B Back to Basics

Discussion points:

- perhaps we could bring a cut off date to the groups to encourage volunteers to chair and fill MWRU committee positions (ie: program chair, registration chair, etc.)
- there are 7 MWRU committees and all are available at this time
- based on experience it is very difficult to secure a date with the hotel later than March when it
  is usually done; the amount of work involved in organizing a round up is enormous and it may
  be impossible in the amount of time left
- suggestion of mid-September as cut-off date

- if the Double Tree (traditional venue) is not available it may be difficult to find another venue
- perhaps we could think about a single day event instead

- does it actually fall to the Central Service chair and the treasurer to step into Mid-Winter Round Up chair and treasurer positions?
- due to post-covid economic climate, we can expect perhaps a \$60 registration fee and \$80 banquet fee on top of that if we organize a round up and don't have enough participants to cover the hotel costs, the CS committee has to cover any shortfalls
- each year we have a chair for each of the seven MWRU committee positions AND a co-chair for each of these positions, so that the co-chair can use their experience and step in the next year - it may be very difficult for someone with zero experience to take on these committees
- a September cut off date should keep in mind that our CS meeting is Sept 6 and we need to make a decision then
- perhaps we could have those AA members with MWRU experience mentor anyone new who would like to take on a position now this is how AA works, we help one another
- the MWRU committee positions get voted in at MWRU meetings, not at the CS table
- suggestion to call a MWRU committee meeting on zoom between now and Sept 6 to see what the turn out is and if anyone wants to get involved it will give us an idea
- the MWRU guidelines are not posted on the website currently and should be
- don't see anywhere in guidelines where it would fall to the CS treasurer to take on MWRU treasurer position
- it is possible it was only the last CS chair, Michael H, who agreed to step in himself as chair of MWRU in 2021 if there were no volunteers
- if a MWRU chair is voted in at the Sept 6 Central Service meeting, they will build their committees/recruit volunteers themselves

Please take back to your groups that if there are no volunteers for MWRU chair/committees at the Sept 6 central service meeting, the 2023 round up will be cancelled.
